Seeing the size of the blocks of marbles and then understanding the logistics of the process gave me immense appreciation for the marble I continued to see throughout Italy, not to mention the many monuments and statues made out of these incredible stones.

Tuscany is on most clients' wishlists and after visiting a handful of villages, hotels and resorts (out of probably thousands I wish I could have visited!) I had a few highlights...















The tuscan coastline offers a stretch of beaches with similarities to the French Riviera but has its own unique feeling. I was fortunate enough to stay at **Plaza e de Russie** in Viareggio which is a perfect spot to situate yourself for a seaside escape. Modern, comfortable and contemporary design rooms with Relais & Chateaux association ensuring you will enjoy unpretentious, homely fresh food in their Michelin star restaurant. Views from your balcony on the boardwalk and ocean are the perfect spot for sunset aperitivo! Walk to dining options, beach clubs, shopping in 30 seconds. Forte dei Marmi, Lucca, Pisa, Arezzo, Siena, San Gimignano, Volterra, Carrara, Torre del Lago Puccini are just some neighboring towns all within reach with a short drive not to mention less than 1.5hrs to Florence.

Six Senses in Rome



All roads lead to Rome but first, I need to gush over the fabulous Six Senses Rome

After an exciting and busy few weeks in Italy I was ready for a reset, pause and pamper which is what I got and then so much more!!! I expected Six Senses to calm my mind but I was not prepared to enter a resort haven in the city center! Space, high ceilings, natural light, textures, smell were some of my first impressions as I entered the hotel and explored the facilities and my beautiful suite. The bottom 3 photos are of my suite (one of my clients fav category) with a huge private terrace overlooking the rooftops and sights of the city. Apart from the stunning accommodations what I can really appreciate is the soundproofing in this hotel. The seal of the windows and doors ensure you don't hear a peep for a peaceful sleep (or afternoon nap!) which not many hotels can boast about. The reason I call this a resort is because there is SO much to do without leaving. I recommend a minimum of 2 nights to do hotel only experiences followed by 2 additional nights minimum for Rome. The spa is outstanding offering a huge selection of treatments. I pampered myself with a herbal healing hammam (wow!) and 'cocoon'. Their roman baths featuring several temperatures are so wonderful. Dining - their food sourcing and philosophy is perfection not to mention delicious and then experiences... complimentary sound bath, crafts for kids and adults,















The Umbria region in central Italy is often called the country's green heart, known for its medieval hill towns, dense forests and local cuisine; particularly foraged truffles and wines.

An absolute gem is Orvieto - a small city perched on a rock cliff with maybe my favorite Duomo, dating from 1290 which has a mosaic facade. The Pozzo di San Patrizio is a 16th-century well shaft with a double spiral staircase with 254 steps each way worth exploring to work off that extra serving of pizza and pasta you 'had to have'! An underground cave network attests to the city's Etruscan roots. What I found so special about Orvieto was that it is small but not too small, offers a large variety of fantastic and inexpensive dining options and is NOT overrun with tourist buses like too many villages sadly.

Possibly my favorite thing about the city is your luxurious accommodation option in a residence at **Palazzo Misciattelli!** Each residence offers top notch luxury amenities, linen, towels, high end appliances and privacy with hotel-like inclusions like daily breakfast, housekeeping, fitness center, sauna etc. A private cooking class with an authentic chef will leave you inspired and excited to hit the kitchen upon your return home. Your residence is in the heart of Orvieto so you are footsteps away from everything you need for a 3 night stay + and short driving distance to a variety of options for a longer visit. Did I mention, you can be in Rome via a quick 1 hour train ride?!



Heading south



Pompeii's archaeological site is a historic city that was immersed in the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in 79 A.D. We discovered what the excavations have revealed about the daily life in Pompeii so far with new discoveries continually occurring. Our private guide was superb, informing us about all of the highlights, weaving us to the best places to understand more about this tragic event and how life was in these times. We were also able to see the sculptures and art that survived the damage caused by the volcanic eruption. The site (city) is huge which is why even as a travel advisor, I get an expert guide to enhance my own personal experience. I adhere to the principle that if I wouldn't personally enjoy it, I wouldn't suggest it to my esteemed clients.



Florence and more of Italy



The cradle of the Renaissance and the world capital of art in the 15th century, Florence boasts one of the oldest historic centers and some of the most famous museums in the world.

Where to start? Brunelleschi's Duomo, Piazza Della Repubblica, Piazza della Signoria, Santa Croce with its tombs of Michelangelo and Galileo, the Ponte Vecchio lined with centuries-old jewelry shops that is topped by the Medici family's secret passageway, Accademia Gallery, visit the famous 'David', the statue that established Michelangelo as the greatest sculptor of his time. Medici Chapels, The Uffizi Gallery, one of the most important galleries in the world. I could go on and that is just one portion.

Florence as a base also allows you to visit neighboring towns for day trips such as Chianti, Siena and San Gimignano.
